- Medical Insurance Information ESP members will follow the policy and procedure guidelines, Section 1. Membership for ASSOCIATE Memberships with the following:
- No Building fund contribution.
- Not entitled to B'nai Mitzvah or Wedding Privileges.
- ESP members who are Jewish are entitled to funeral privileges—Subject to the guidelines found in the TBE Policies and Procedures, Section F (Funeral, Cemetery, Shiva).

# Education Subscription Program (ESP) ESP Membership Policy/Procedures:

<u>Purpose:</u> The program is designed to encourage new memberships from families with young school aged children. The program allows for a one-to-two-year, lower cost, and trial period before advancing to standard membership.

**Eligibility:** The program is available to new families with children who have not yet entered 5th grade (Gimmel). The program will be available for no more than two years to any individual family. All children of a family in grades Pre-K/K through Bet are eligible to be enrolled. Families who enter the program with a child in Bet will only be eligible to be enrolled in the program for one year.

<u>Restrictions:</u> Gimmel (5 th), Dalet (6 th) and Hai (7 th) are considered B'nai Mitzvah preparation years. Families are required to become full members to have children enrolled in these grades. Therefore, families with older children are not eligible to be enrolled in the Education Subscription Program.

# **HIGH HOLY DAY CALENDAR 5784**

#### Rosh Hashanah
